- Identifies potential positive and negative impacts on health of residents
- Organized by Health Effect Categories

# 15.8 HIA Study – Q3 2013 Update

#### HIA Methodology Overview

- Health Effects Categories Under Evaluation
  - Social determinants of health
  - Accidents and injuries
  - Potential exposure to hazardous materials
  - Food, nutrition, and subsistence activity
  - Infectious disease
  - Water and sanitation
  - Non-communicable and chronic diseases
  - Health services infrastructure and capacity

## 15.8 HIA Study – Q3 2013 Update<sup>5</sup>

- Relationship with Other Studies
  - Transportation
  - Air Quality
  - H₂O Quality/Monitoring
  - Hg Bioaccumulation
  - Erosion
  - Subsistence
  - Social Conditions
  - Recreation/River Use
  - Engineering



- Potentially affected communities (PACs) under evaluation according to HECs
  - Proximity
  - Exposure to hazards
  - Construction camp communities
  - Transportation corridors
  - Railway corridor
  - Subsistence use populations
  - Downstream communities & populations
  - Port facility areas

## 15.8 Activities - Q3 2013 Update

- Collected food consumption/nutrition data with ADF&G:
  - Jan 20-26, 2013 Talkeetna, Chase, Trapper Creek
  - Feb 10-17, 2013 Cantwell
  - Feb 19-Mar 2, 2013 Gakona
- Conducted community health observations in Kenny Lake, Talkeetna, Chase, Trapper Creek, Cantwell, and Gakona
- Initiated baseline literature review ongoing
- Developed health key informant health interview plan and conducted health discussions in Cantwell following the TLK workshop
- Identified initial potential data gaps

- Documented baseline data collected through literature review, community observations and health discussions

- Potential health issues being documented
